Leading Off

- Texas Tech baseball enters the season as a unanimous top-four team for the first time in program history. It's the fourth consecutive year starting at No. 3 in at least one poll and the highest it has ever started.
- For just the second time in the last 13 years, Tech opens the season away from home. Dating back to 2009, the Red Raiders have opened every season in Lubbock except for 2017 when they kicked off in Starkville, Miss.
- Texas Tech is 7-2 all-time in season openers under Tadlock and 27-4 in opening-weekend series. Tech's only two losses on opening days under Tadlock came in 2019 to Oregon and in 2014 to No. 3 Indiana. The Red Raiders have "won" opening weekend every year after a 2-2 split in 2008, the final year under Larry Hays.
- Globe Life Field will be the first of two Major League parks for Tech this season as it will also make an appearance at Minute Maid in March for the Shriners' Hospital for Children College Classic. The Red Raiders last played in an MLB stadium in 2017 when they - coincidentally - played in both Arlington and Houston as well.
- The DFW metroplex is a "second home" for Texas Tech's athletic programs. Not only is it one of the largest alumni bases for Texas Tech, but it is also primary recruiting grounds. In fact, a fourth of Tech's 2021 roster hails from DFW, including Dylan Neuse from Fort Worth, Micah Dallas from Aubrey and Kurt Wilson from Arlington itself.
- The 2021 season marks the 72nd edition of Texas Tech baseball and the ninth under the leadership of Tim Tadlock. Since arriving in 2013, Tadlock has led the Red Raiders to five NCAA Regionals, the program's first four College World Series appearances and three Big 12 Championships.
- Tadlock returns 24 letter winners and welcomes 20 newcomers to the roster in 2021. Of those returning, 16 have experience on college baseball's biggest stage in Omaha as members of either the 2018 or 2019 clubs.
- Tadlock has signed a top-25 class every season since arriving in Lubbock. His 2020 class finished at No. 17 according to D1Baseball, and he signed the No. 1 junior college class in the country according to Perfect Game.
- Because the 2020 COVID season did not count against student-athlete eligibility, classifications for all returners on the 2021 roster carried over from 2020 to accurately represent remaining years of eligibility. The "experience" has been updated to differentiate between first-year freshmen (HS) and second-year freshmen (1L).

Texas Tech Notes

INSIDE THE SERIES - ARKANSAS

- Saturday's meeting will be the 62nd all-time between the two programs
- The series dates back to 1974 when the teams met annually as members of the Southwest Conference
- The Red Raiders and Razorbacks met every year from 1974-1991.
- There have been six meetings since 1995 with five of those coming since 2012, including the last two at the CWS.
- Tim Tadlock is 1-4 against Arkansas, dropping the first four matchups before winning the latest battle in an elimination game at the 2019 College World Series.
- This will be the seventh time the two teams have met at a neutral field and the third time in an MLB park as Minute Maid hosted matchups in 2012 and 2016.

INSIDE THE SERIES - OLE MISS

- Sunday's meeting will be the third all-time between the Red Raiders and Rebels.
- Both meetings have come under Tadlock as the series is split one game apiece.
- Sunday will be the second time the two teams have met in an MLB stadium with Minute Maid hosting in 2017.
- The programs met for the first time at the 2014 College World Series as the Rebels survived an elimination game.

INSIDE THE SERIES - MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Monday's meeting will be the eighth all-time between the Red Raiders and Bulldogs.
- The Bulldogs hold a 4-3 edge in the series. Tech won the first three meetings, while MSU has now won four in a row.
- Tim Tadlock will be looking to improve on his 1-4 mark against MSU.
- Tech has seen Mississippi State three of the last four years for a total of five matchups, the most of any SEC team.
- Four of the five matchups since 2017 have taken place in the state of Mississippi
- This will be just the second time in eight contests Tech will face the Bulldogs in the state of Texas with the other coming in Frisco in 2019.
- Tech and MSU ended their abbreviated 2020 seasons against one another as the midweek series in Biloxi finished a day before the season began to shut down.

72ND SEASON OF RED RAIDER BASEBALL

2021 marks the 72nd edition of Texas Tech baseball in Lubbock. The Red Raider program began in 1926 and lasted four years before going on hiatus until 1954. As Tech enters the 2021 season, a total of 3,106 games have been played in the school's history, as Tech has amassed a 1776-1322-8 overall record with 45 winning seasons prior to the 2020 shortened season. Tech has been historically good at home, putting together a 1,144-508-5 clip in Lubbock.

2020 SEASON REVIEW

The Red Raiders started out 16-1, including a 2-0 road sweep at No. 9 Florida State, on their way to a No. 1 ranking for the first time since the 1997 season. Tadlock's crew looked built to not only get back to Omaha for the third straight year, but to finish the job.

As it does every year, Tech had to replace some key pieces in Josh Jung, Cameron Warren and Gabe Holt in the lineup as well as Saturday starter Caleb Kilian. But with six position starters returning and an impressive group of freshmen ready to step in, the offense didn't skip a beat. On the mound, Clayton Beeter went from closer to ace, Bryce Bonnin showed development, and the rest of the pitching staff proved to be a dynamic force early on.

Tech heads into 2021 looking to replace a key bat with the departure of senior Brian Klein, but much like 2020, returns a wealth of experience with eight position starters returning from last year and several more who have seen regular playing time in their careers.

On the mound, Micah Dallas and Mason Montgomery will look to anchor two of the starting roles early on. The bullpen is deep once again with several talented arms. Watch out for a freshman class that has earned comparisons from Tadlock to his 2016 group of freshmen that featured Davis Martin, Steven Gingery, Ryan Shetter and Ty Harpenau.

2021 ROSTER BREAKDOWN

SENIORS

Two players are in their final years of eligibility in veteran relief pitcher Connor Queen and graduate transfer Patrick Monteverde, the Seton Hill transfer who receives the Opening Day start.

JUNIORS

There are nine members of the junior class with two years of eligibility remaining. All nine were members of the team last season, headlined by Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year Dylan Neuse. This will be the fourth year on campus for four of these juniors, including Braxton Fulford, Parker Kelly, Cody Masters, Ryan Sublette and Kurt Wilson.

SOPHOMORES

The sophomore class consists of 12 members, including eight returners and four transfers. This will be year three in the program for several mainstays such as Micah Dallas, Mason Montgomery, Dru Baker, Cole Stilwell and Max Marusak. Tech's top-ranked JUCO class features RHP Brandon Birdsell, LHP Brandon Petix, INF/OF Braydon Runion and RHP Chase Webster.

"FRESHMEN"

Call them what you want, but this group packs plenty of firepower. Cal Conley, Jace Jung, Nate Rombach and Dillon Carter all earned starting roles to open the 2020 season. Andrew Devine also showed dynamic stuff in a closing role.

FRESHMEN

Tech welcomes 14 first-year freshmen to the mix from a class that finished at No. 17 by D1Baseball. Tadlock and crew placed an emphasis on adding quality arms with 11 of the 14 additions coming on the mound.

OPENING WEEKEND ROTATION

Tadlock will hand the ball off to grad transfer **Patrick Monteverde** for opening day against the Razorbacks. Monteverde comes to Tech from Seton Hill, a D-II school located in Greensburg, Penn. Monteverde is a 6-2 lefty that signed with Virginia Wesleyan out of high school. His velocity has improved during his collegiate career as he was one of the most highly touted prospects in the transfer portal, choosing Tech over Miami, Auburn, Indiana and 36 others.

Micah Dallas gets the nod on Sunday against Ole Miss. Dallas was the Friday night starter as a freshman in 2019 during Tech's Big 12 Championship season and run to Omaha. He began 2020 coming out of the bullpen and was sensational, posting a 0.57 ERA, 23 strikeouts and only one walk in 15.2 innings of relief.

Mason Montgomery will start the finale against Mississippi State. The 6-2 lefty was consistent in his midweek starts last season, going 3-1 with a 3.00 ERA. He spent time in the weekend rotation as a freshman in 2019. Improved his strikeout-to-walk ratio from 0.92 in 2019 to 2.86 in 2020.

MURRELL SEES OLD TEAM AGAIN

Texas Tech junior Easton Murrell will square off against his former team for the second time since transferring to Lubbock from Arkansas. He joined the Red Raiders prior to the 2019 season, when Tech made its latest run to the College World Series. Murrell got the start in the elimination game, and homered in the fifth to tie the score at 3-3 before the Red Raiders eventually went on to send the Hogs home with a 5-4 win. Murrell is one of three Razorbacks that have transferred to Tech in the last few years, along with RHP Bryce Bonnin and newcomer Jackson Cobb. The Red Raiders took Bonnin and turned him into a third round draft pick in the 2020 MLB Draft last summer.

TECH BASEBALL IN HIGH DEMAND

Red Raider fans have flocked to Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park over the last several seasons, creating an intense home-field advantage. COVID-19 safety protocols may limit the number of fans in attendance, but there's never been more hype surrounding the program, and The Law is sure to bring the energy once again in 2021.

Texas Tech sold out its season ticket allotment in 2020 for the sixth-straight season, a trend that is sure to continue in 2021 due to the limited ticket supply. Red Raider fans were top-10 in total attendance in both 2018 and 2019, including a single-season program record of 144,339 fans packing the stands in 2019.

STRONG SCHEDULE AWAITS

Tadlock has consistently put together one of the toughest schedules in the country, and this year will be no different.

STARTING SHORTHANDED

Tadlock and company have formed a roster full of talent and as deep as anyone in the country. Few teams could overcome the loss of Austin Becker, Jacob Brustoski and Hunter Dobbins from its pitching staff, but that's exactly what Tech is built to do. Becker started on Sundays last year after transferring in from Vanderbilt. Dobbins impressed in his midweek starts and was a likely option to earn a weekend role. Meanwhile, Brustoski was perhaps the top left-hander in the bullpen early last season after coming in as a JUCO product.

HEAD COACHES AT THEIR ALMA MATERS

Tim Tadlock is one of just two coaches in the Big 12 and one of 10 in a "power-5" to currently lead his alma mater.

The 2021 season is the ninth as head coach at Texas Tech for Tim Tadlock. During his tenure, Tadlock has built his alma mater into a national powerhouse, leading the Red Raiders to four College World Series in the last seven years and claiming three of the last four Big 12 Championships.

A two-time National Coach of the Year, Tadlock was named head coach of his alma mater on June 8, 2012, becoming the ninth head coach in program history. Tadlock will enter his 29th year in collegiate baseball in 2020. He owns a collegiate career record of 736-282 in 17 years as a head coach with nine seasons at Grayson County College (435-127) and eight at Texas Tech (301-155).

Under Tadlock, the Red Raiders have become a national contender. Tech is one of three schools in the nation to advance to the College World Series four times since 2014, including consecutive trips in 2018 and 2019 for the first time in school history. It is also one of three schools in the country to earn a national seed three times since 2016, and the only program to host an NCAA Regional four straight years dating back to 2016.

During Tadlock's eight seasons, the Red Raiders have recorded five 45+ win seasons and three Big 12 titles. Individually, Tech has earned 38 All-America honors, 27 Freshman All-America honors, a College Baseball Foundation National Pitcher of the Year and two Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Awards. At the conference level, Tech has accumulated 51 All-Big 12 selections, three Big 12 Player of the Years, a Big 12 Pitcher of the Year, two Big 12 Freshman of the Years and a Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

The Red Raiders have had 50 student-athletes selected in the MLB Draft under Tadlock, including a school-record 11 in 2018. Overall, Tadlock has coached 159 MLB Draft picks, including at least one draft pick during the last 25 seasons and has coached four first-round selections, 16 players taken in the top five rounds and 44 selections in the top-10 rounds of the draft during his coaching career. Tadlock's players have heard their names called a lot recently in the MLB Draft with 59 selections over the last nine years (2012-20). Eight years during his coaching career Tadlock has had at least nine players taken in the draft.

With the remarkable team success, Tech fans have packed Rip Griffin Park in Tadlock's eight seasons. In 2015, Texas Tech sold out its season ticket allotment for the first time ever following its first appearance in the CWS. The 2020 season marked the sixth-straight that season tickets have sold out prior to the start of the season, coming off a school-record 144,339 fans who filled Rip Griffin Park during the 2019 campaign. Tech has consistently ranked among the national leaders in attendance, finishing in the top 15 each year since 2015 while compiling a 137-38 home record in that span.

Tech opened 2020 with lofty expectations yet again, looking to defend its Big 12 title and make another run to Omaha. Tadlock's crew, who starting as high as No. 3 in the preseason polls for the third straight year, opened the season 16-3 and climbed to No. 1 in the polls at one point for the first time since 1997. The season, however, ended abruptly in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Red Raiders had a successful 2020 MLB Draft with right-handers Clayton Beeter and Bryce Bonnin both selected in the five-round draft. Tech was one of two Big 12 schools with multiple players chosen and extended its streak to 30 consecutive years with a draft pick, the third longest streak in the country. Additionally, the 41 Red Raiders that have been drafted since 2015 is the most in the Big 12 and in the state.

Tadlock returned to his alma mater for the 2012 season as the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator. During his one season in this role, the Red Raiders had a school-record nine MLB Draft picks, including first-round selection center fielder Barrett Barnes, who became the third highest draft pick in school history with the 45th overall pick.

After beginning his college coaching career as an assistant at Hill College (1993-96) for four seasons, Tadlock became the head coach at Grayson County Junior College, where he led the Vikings to back-to-back National Junior College Athletic Association World Series titles in 1999 and 2000. During his nine seasons at Grayson, Tadlock posted a 435-127 (.774) overall record while being named National Coach of the Year following both title runs (1999-2000).

After a prep career at Denton High School and two years at Hill College, Tadlock was a two-year starting shortstop for the Red Raiders while helping Texas Tech to its first-ever 40-win season as a senior in 1991 (42-18). In his two-year career at Tech, Tadlock played in 120 games, batted .289 (120-for-415) with 96 runs scored, 19 doubles, four triples, eight home runs, 68 RBI, 71 walks, 65 strikeouts and was 28-of-41 in stolen bases. Tadlock played for legendary coach Larry Hays while at Texas Tech.

Tadlock graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education from Texas Tech in May 1992. He also earned a master's degree in education in August 1994 from the University of Texas at Tyler. Tadlock and his wife, Kelly, have two children, daughter, Chloe, and son, Benjamin. Tadlock is originally from Denton, Texas, and was born in 1968.

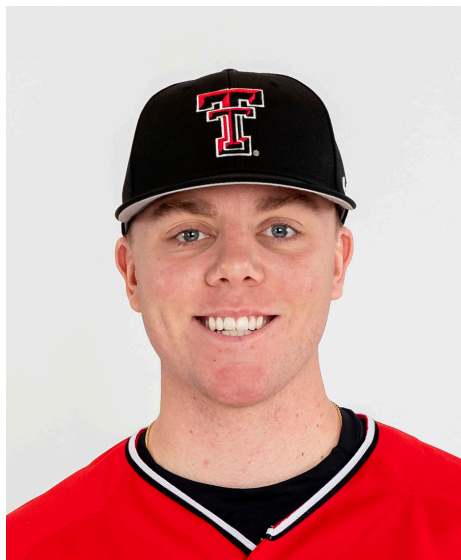
